**BRITISH VIRGIN ISLANDS PORTS AUTHORITY ACT, 1990
(No. 12 of 1990)**

British Virgin Islands Ports Authority (Amendment) Regulations, 2021

[Gazetted 15th April, 2021]

The Minister, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 94 of the British Virgin Islands Ports Authority Act, 1990 (No. 12 of 1990) and section 15 of the said Act makes the following Regulations:

Citation and commencement.

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the British Virgin Islands Ports Authority (Amendment) Regulations, 2021.

(2) These Regulations shall come into force on the 15th day of April, 2021.

Regulation 102 amended.

2. Regulation 102 of the British Virgin Islands Ports Authority Regulations, 1995 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulations) is amended by deleting regulation 102 and substituting with the following:

“Wharfage. **102.** Wharfage as set out in

Third Schedule

(a) paragraph (a) of Item E of the Third Schedule shall be paid on all goods landed from or loaded into a vessel at any harbour or other place in the Territory; and

(b) paragraph (b) of Item E of the Third Schedule shall be charged on petroleum products discharged through ships pipeline direct to private facility of cargo owners.”.

Regulation 103 amended.

3. Regulation 103 of the principal Regulations is amended by deleting paragraph (a).

Third Schedule amended.

4. The Third Schedule is amended by inserting

(a) paragraph (a) before the first item;

(b) after paragraph (a) the following new paragraph:

“(b) \$0.10 per gallon on petroleum products discharged through ships pipeline direct to private facility of cargo owners”.
